Apparently she spoke with Pam Finnegan, from Westar, and they discussed maybe just setting a poll and installing 1 light. Alicia was not sure that she would like any poles or lights. The school lights up enough for all of them. I have contacted Pam, with Westar, to see what we can do to please Fred and Alicia Wood.

Pam came into city hall after talking with Alicia. We discussed the lighting. Do we want to put both poles at the Wood property and just put one light as far away from them as possible? They will not need to trim the oak tree. We also discussed the Pearl and Vine light. We believe it will work
